

Monthly Saver Account
Supplement to Terms and Conditions
As at 1 January 2018

This document

1. The Anglican Diocese of Armidale Diocesan Development Fund (DDF) is governed by the Diocesan Development Fund Ordinance 2017 (DDF Ordinance). This document is a supplement to and should be read in conjunction with the Investment Products Terms and Conditions (as at 1 January 2018). Taken together, this document and the Terms and Conditions comprise the terms and conditions for the Monthly Saver Account. If there is any inconsistency between this document and the Investment Products Terms and Conditions (as at 1 January 2018), the latter terms and conditions prevail.

2. The DDF Ordinance, the Diocesan Development Fund Identification Statement and financial statements can be found on the Diocesan website: www.armidaleanglicandiocese.com .
3. Under the DDF Ordinance, the DDF is guaranteed by the Anglican Diocese of Armidale as stated in Section 27. This guarantee is provided to the DDF and not to individual investors in the DDF.
4. The DDF does not have an Australian Financial Services Licence.

Who may invest?

5. The Monthly Saver Account is available to parishes, Diocesan agencies, clergy, Diocesan and voluntary staff of the Anglican Diocese of Armidale. These persons are referred to in the Terms and Conditions as ***associates***.
6. Parishioners of the Anglican Diocese of Armidale may also apply to invest in the Monthly Saver Account if they satisfy the following criteria:
 - a. they are 18 years of age or more;
 - b. they have primarily and usually attended services of public worship for a period of no less than three (3) months in a parochial district of the Anglican Diocese of Armidale prior to signalling their intention to invest in the DDF; and
 - c. they are not a member of any other Christian denomination.

These persons are referred to in the Terms and Conditions as ***retail, non-associated clients***.

7. The DDF only intends to attract investors whose primary purpose for making their investment is to support the work of the Anglican Diocese of Armidale. The DDF is required to advise that investors may be unable to get some or all of their money back when the investor expects or

at all. The DDF is not comparable to investments with banks, finance companies or fund managers.

Not equivalent to other transactional accounts

8. The Monthly Saver Account is suitable for short-term investments of a month or more. It is not intended to provide **retail, non-associated clients** with a daily transaction account equivalent to a bank or other financial institution. Your investment is not available to you 'at call'.
9. There are restrictions regarding the period of notice an investor must provide to the DDF to withdraw money in their account and other restrictions affecting transactions on their account. The following will apply if you are a **retail, non-associated clients**:
 - a. 31 Days' written notice is required if the investment is to be repaid;
 - b. in cases of financial hardship, exceptional circumstances will be considered by the DDF; and
 - c. when an investment is to be repaid, the DDF is only able to transfer funds from the account to an account in the name of the investor with an Australian Authorised Deposit-taking Institution or by cheque.
10. The DDF may only repay an investment in the DDF if it has reasonable grounds to be satisfied as to its ability to meet the repayment requests made by you and other investors in the DDF.
11. If you are a retail client (which may include some persons who are **associates**) you are required to provide a signed 'investor acknowledgement' to the DDF when you open the account. **You will be told if this requirement applies to you.** If you are required to provide an investor acknowledgement at the time of account opening you are also required to provide one each time your investment in the account increases. Interest rate and charges

12. The variable interest rate on the Monthly Saver Account is currently 2.45 per cent p.a. calculated daily and paid monthly on the daily balance in the account for new investors.
13. Variable interest rates are set by the DDF Board, based on considerations of such factors as the rates of interest offered in the market, market conditions and the cash rate determined by the Reserve Bank of Australia.
14. The DDF does not impose any fees or charges on investments in the Monthly Saver Account.

Investor Statements

15. Investor statements will be issued to investors annually for the 12 month period to 30 June. You may contact the DDF Administrative Officer if you require an interim statement.
